

A.R.R.L. DX Contest Results Febuary - March

1948

Contesting, then as now, was an important activity

1948 was the first time RDXA entered as a Group and had Sectional winners in both phone & CW

This is the first DX Contest that the club has entered as a group. It is obvious that many didn't participate - but, regardless, for a small group, and a new one at that, our "Grand Score" wasn't too bad.

W2FBA, the 1947 CW winner for the HDXA and Western New York, came thru again on top with a vy fb score. "Bob" had very close competition from W2PUD until the very end at which time W2FBA made a "kill" on 3500 kc. and jumped well in the lead.

The phone contest was equally interesting. Our assoc. member W2AFQ went all out to run up the tremendous score of 142,200 points. "Jim" had very little competition in the NDTA or Western New York and ended up with one of the highest scores in the country. Again W2FBA was a high scorer with W2PUN as operator. (The CW contest was enough for Bob - hi 1)

In passing comment, the "Gang" is proud to have with them, for two years in succession, the A.R.R.L. DX Sectional Winners - both Phone and CW. It puts the Rochester "Gang" on the map !!
