# RDXA Shorted Grid Award Rules for CY 2014

#### Overview:

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For 2014 the Shorted Grid Award is designed to recognize and reward the versatile RDXA member. This is an operator who operates several of the popular and well recognized modes as well as being able to operate multiple bands. There is only one entry class: single Operator, assisted OK, 100 watts max power, from one location, RDXA members only.

## Phase 1 Qualification MODE Capability:

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To qualify for the SG award you must perform any three (3) of the following 2-way MODE challenges:

Accomplish five different DXCC QSO's using SSB phone. Accomplish five different DXCC QSO's CW using ONLY with a straight key. Accomplish five different DXCC QSO's using RTTY Accomplish five different DXCC QSO's using any combination of JT65/JT9

## Phase 2 Qualification BAND Capability:

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To qualify for the SG Award you must accomplish three 2-way QSO's, any mode, on each of any 9 of the following 10 bands: 160, 80, 40, 30, 20, 17, 15, 12, 10 and 6 meters.

Phase 3: Work as many ARRL DXCC entities as possible:

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any band, any mode, using ARRL DXCC rules, over the course of the entire 2014 calendar year. One entity, one time, no band/mode multiples.

Phase 4: Work 25 US States:

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outside of contests, any band, any mode, 100 watts max. W1AW/portable special event contacts made after July 1, 2014 are allowed.

## Scoring:

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Simple, one point per entity. Qualification phase QSO's do count for phase 3 totals but in no case will an entity be worth more than one point. Sequence is unimportant. You can start Phase 3 anytime and finish phase 2 last, for example. Phase 1, 2, and 3 may be worked during contests; but not Phase 4.

QSL's and Logs:

QSL verifications are not required. Logs must be maintained in a manner acceptable to ARRL contest rules. Entries must be submitted via email to <u>wb2sxy@arrl.net</u> not later than Jan 14, 2015. Logs may be requested by the 2014 SG contest chairman Bill Kasperkoski WB2SXY, with many thanks to Ed K2MP.
